### 1. Refugees from the north settled in Jerusalem (722 BC)

- A. Jerusalem grows from 12 acres to 150, largest in region
- B. Population of Jerusalem from 1k to 12k, Judah doubles
- C. Settlements in the Shephelah (country) from 20 to 275
- D. Shrines in Arad, Beer-sheba and Lachish are destroyed

### 2. Themes from Hezekiah’s Reign

- A. The **Temple** becomes the only place to worship (Ps 11:4)  
*The Lord is in his holy temple;  
the Lord is on his heavenly throne.*
- B. Jerusalem “**Zion**” becomes the (Ps 78:67-68)  
*Then he rejected the tents of Joseph,  
he did not choose the tribe of Ephraim;  
but he chose the tribe of Judah,  
Mount Zion, which he loved.*
- C. Hezekiah becomes the new “**David**” (Ps 18:50)  
*He gives his king great victories;  
he shows unfailing love to his anointed,  
to David and to his descendants forever.*

and restore its ruins—  
and will rebuild it as it used to be."*
