must <b>keep</b> their tongue from evil	natsor (nun)
and their lips from deceitful speech.	
11 They must <b>turn</b> from evil and do good;	suwr (samech)
they must seek peace and pursue it.	
12 For the <b>eyes</b> of the Lord are on the righ	teous eyney (ayin)
and his ears are attentive to their prayer,	
but the <b>face</b> of the Lord is against those w	ho do evil." paney (pe)
[to blot out their name from the earth.]	
13 Who is going to <b>harm</b> you	kakóo
if you are <b>eager</b> to do good?	zelotés
14 But even if you should <b>suffer</b>	páscho
for what is <b>right</b> ,	dikaiosúne
you are <b>blessed</b> .	makários
"Do not fear their threats; do not be frightened.	" Isaiah 8:2
15 But in your hearts <b>revere</b> Christ as Lord.	hagiázo

Always be <b>prepared</b>	hétoimos	
to give an <b>answer</b> to everyone who asks you	apología	
to give the <b>reason</b> for the hope that you have.	lógos	
But do this with		
gentleness	praútes	
and <b>respect</b> ,	phóbos	
16 keeping a clear <b>conscience</b> ,	suneídesis	
so that those <b>who speak maliciously</b>	katalaléo	
against your good behavior in Christ	anastrophé	
may be ashamed		
of their slander.		
17 For it is better, if it is God's will,		
to suffer for <b>doing good</b>	agathopoiéo	
than for <b>doing evil</b> .	kakopoiéo

18 For Christ also <b>suffered</b>	páscho	
once for <b>sins</b> ,	hamartía	
the righteous for the unrighteous,	díkaios	
to bring you to God.		
He was <b>put to death</b> in the body	thanatóo	
but <b>made alive in</b> the Spirit.	zoopoiéo	
19 After being made alive,		
he went and made proclamation	kerússo	
to the imprisoned spirits—		
20 to those who were <b>disobedient</b> long ago	See 1 Enoch 12:5-6; Jude 6-7	
when God waited patiently in the days of I	Noah	
while the ark was being built.		
In it only a few people, eight in all,		
were <b>saved</b> through water,	diasózo	
21 and this water <b>symboliz</b>	es baptism antítupon	
that now <b>saves</b> you also—	sózo	
not the removal of dirt from the body		
but the pledge of a clear conscience toward God.		
lt <b>saves</b> you by the resurrection of Jesus Christ,		
22 who has gone into heaven		
and is at God's right hand—		
with angels, authorities and powers		
in submission to him.
